Richard Leonard Schmidt, 78, of Richmond and former Roseville resident, died Friday morning October 9, 2009, at Mt. Clemens Regional Medical Center, Mt. Clemens.

He was born Monday, January 19, 1931, in Detroit the son of the late Anthony and Anna (Kyrie) Schmidt.

His marriage to Rosina Dorner was Saturday, May 9, 1953, in Detroit.

Richard served his country with the United States Army from 1951 to 1953 as Second Lieutenant.

He was a self-employed retail salesman selling Borden's and Hostess products for 40 years until his retirement. He was a parishioner of St. Augustine Catholic Church, Richmond, and member of Knights of Columbus Pope Leo 13th of Eastpointe.

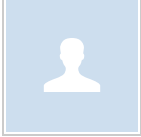
